andel's *Silete venti*, the major work on this program, is a spectacular solo motet for soprano and Baroque orchestra, one that rivals his best operatic scenes. It places a deeply religious soul within a naturalistic context, where rustling leaves and blooming flowers prompt a lush meditation on love and happiness. *Ecstatic Visions* spotlights members of the ensemble as well, in rapturous instrumental music by Ciprano da Rore, Johann Schmeltzer, and Jean-Philippe Rameau.

we and Wonder features two major works for chorus and orchestra, one on the creation story and the other on the incarnation of Christ. As set to music by C. P. E. Bach, Friedrich Klopstock's Morning Song on the Feast of Creation blends Enlightenment thought with Christian theology, while Marc-Antoine Charpentier's Midnight Mass for Christmas enlivens its canonic text with French carol melodies. Heinrich Biber's Serenade of the Nightwatchman adds an expectant note to this festive holiday program.

ugal Games takes up an enigmatic though quintessentially Baroque mode of music-making while celebrating the release of artistic director Matthew Dirst's new book on Bach's *Art of Fugue and Musical Offering,* the composer's ultimate demonstrations of learned counterpoint. With significant excerpts from both works, this program also supplies context in the form of miniature marvels by Dietrich Buxtehude and George Philipp Telemann.



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
